

Fastbraces

A straighter, more evenly aligned smile looks attractive and can be healthier as teeth become easier to clean thoroughly, reducing the risk of dental disease. Traditional orthodontics uses a twostep system to straighten teeth and correct problems caused by a bad bite.


During the first year of treatment, the tooth crown (the part visible in the mouth) is moved into the proper position. The tooth roots are moved into their correct locations in year two, during the second stage of treatment. Once the tooth roots are in place, it takes time for the bone around them, called alveolar bone to remodel, ensuring teeth are held firmly in their new locations.

Fastbraces is a comprehensive orthodontic system, just like traditional orthodontics, but it uses patented braces technologies based on decades of research and development. These technologies help to straighten teeth quickly and safely, and more comfortably.



The Difference in Choosing Fastbraces





Old Braces

FASTBRACES®

Fastbraces provides excellent results but works differently compared to traditional orthodontics systems. Instead of a two-step process, the tooth crown and the root are moved together. Once the tooth roots have moved, the patented technology used by Fastbraces helps to restore alveolar bone more quickly. Because tooth roots move immediately, there is less root resorption compared with traditional braces. Often there is no need for tooth extractions.

These braces are designed differently to traditional braces. There is just a single orthodontic wire made from nickeltitanium and which is very elastic. Conventional brace brackets are square, but Fastbraces brackets are elbowshaped, helping to improve the flexibility of the wire. The design of the brackets and wire provides additional torquing in the jaw as teeth and tooth roots move to their new positions, ensuring the tooth root moves during the entire treatment. The single wire means that teeth are easier to clean during treatment. Fastbraces are available with metal brackets, or with clear brackets. Clear brackets do cost a little more.

The Benefits of Fastbraces



One of the main benefits of Fastbraces is the speed of treatment. Instead of waiting weeks or months to see any changes, Fastbraces begins providing visible results within a matter of days, and you could finish treatment within six or seven months. Most people complete treatment in less than a year, but it might take as little as one hundred days.

Fastbraces is more comfortable compared with other braces due to the advanced technologies used to reposition teeth and which restore the alveolar bone around these teeth more quickly. Simultaneously moving the tooth crown and tooth root is gentler, and there is less friction. The braces are lighter, and the materials used to construct them are more flexible.

Faster treatment times require fewer dental visits, so there is less need to take time off from school or work. Shorter treatment times and fewer dental visits are also reflected in the price, so teeth straightening is more affordable.

Using Fastbraces to correct tooth positions can be useful in preparation for other dental treatments, such as placing dental crowns, veneers or before dental implant treatment.

Who Can Have Fastbraces?

Fastbraces can treat a wide range of orthodontic problems normally addressed with conventional braces. These include malocclusion or bad bites, such as open bites, crossbites, underbites and overbites. Fastbraces can address issues with incorrectly spaced teeth and which are too crowded or have unsightly gaps between them. Treatment is generally suitable for older children, teens and adults. You do need to have teeth that are strong and healthy enough to move safely.
